


Building Pathways

STUDENT INTERESTS



Through an interest inventory, students answer a series of questions about their preferences for, say, working with people or numbers, indoors or outside. Their interests are matched with career clusters and pathways.



For example: When it came to planning high school courses, the student would be sure to take enough science credits. Perhaps he or she would even sign up for a dual-enrollment class in chemistry and anatomy at a local community college with the idea of transferring those credits to a university nursing program after graduation.
