FOOTNOTES:

- Colorado schools receiving an academic-performance rating of "unsatisfactory" may enter into voluntary restructuring.
- Georgia does not assign ratings to low-performing schools other than AYP designations. It labels high-performing schools based on a combination of AYP and state-developed performance indicators.
- The Illinois School Code authorizes the state board of education to change the recognition status of a school or school district to "nonrecognized."
- The Maryland General Assembly approved a one-year moratorium that prohibits the state board of education from removing a public school from the direct control of the Baltimore City Board of School Commissioners or implementing a major restructuring of a governance arrangement of a public school in the Baltimore city school system.
